

What is Spread the Harvest?

Spread the Harvest is a program of Sustainable Food Center (SFC) that seeks to reduce financial barriers to food gardening by providing Travis County residents with free gardening resources, including:

- Vegetable seeds available year round at SFC
- Transplants and compost available twice a year during Resource Give-Away Days
- Fish emulsion & liquefied seaweed available by demand at SFC
- Access to SFC's book lending library
- Subscription to SFC's weekly newsletter, which contains information on upcoming gardening events, classes, volunteer opportunities and more
- Gardening assistance from staff
- Assistance establishing neighborhood gardening clubs

Who Qualifies?

SFC accepts applications for Spread the Harvest from:

- Low-income gardeners (see reverse side of this sheet for qualifying income thresholds)
- School gardeners
- Communal gardeners and service providers that work with and provide food to underprivileged individuals and communities

Program Requirements

In exchange for receiving free resources, participants agree to track the amount of food they harvest and share. Four times a year - in January, April, July, and October - Grow Local staff survey gardeners (either by email or phone) to learn how their garden is growing.
